



Tip of the Month: Serving

Try not to hit the serve too hard; usually 70-80 per cent pace is good enough, especially if you can get above 60 percent of your first serves in play accurately, and then just every now and then hit a really big one just to keep your opponent guessing. Variation is vital; no matter how good your serve is, if your opponent knows where it's going they will have a far greater chance of returning it effectively, so make sure you not only vary the direction but also the speed and type of spin you put on the ball.

Irrespective of your natural game plan, serve and volley occasionally as a surprise tactic no matter what surface you're playing on; this will help keep your opponent guessing as to what tactics you're going to try after the serve so they won't have the utmost confidence when selecting what type of return to try and hit.

If all else fails, hit your serve to your opponent's weakness most of the time and force them come up with a shot.



Breathe Easy This Spring: TIPS for Fighting Allergies

People with allergies can breathe easy this spring if they know how to take control with three key survival techniques. Allergy sufferers can use avoidance, medication and allergy shots to not only survive, but also feel good during peak allergy season.

According to the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, an estimated 50 million Americans have from some type of allergy. Allergic rhinitis or hay fever is one of the most common allergies, affecting 10 percent to 30 percent of the population. Hay fever is caused by an allergy to the pollen from trees, grasses or weeds, or the spores of molds. Typical symptoms are sneezing, itchy and watery eyes, runny nose and a burning sensation on the palate or in the throat. Asthma is another type of allergy. These conditions are often associated with other ailments including sinusitis, ear infections, nasal polyps, respiratory infections, sleep disorders and orthodontic problems.

Allergies can be controlled with a combination of actions and treatment, including:

AVOIDANCE: reducing exposure to the things that trigger allergy symptoms, such as molds, pollens, dust, and pet dander. Avoidance is the best allergy treatment and should be continued even when taking medication or receiving immunotherapy.

MEDICATIONS: taking antihistamines, decongestants and nasal sprays and eye drops to control symptoms including sneezing, watery eyes, runny nose and congestion. Today's medications for allergies are better than ever and do not cause side effects such as drowsiness and dry mouth.

IMMUNOTHERAPY: receiving allergy shots to gradually decrease sensitivity and build immunity to the things that cause allergy symptoms. Allergy shots often reduce and can eliminate the need to take medication and are recommended when patients don't respond well to medications, experience side

effects from medications or are exposed to an allergen year-round.

"People often overlook immunotherapy but they should be aware that this treatment option is very effective, particularly for patients who continue to suffer despite medications," Dr. Blaiss said. "The treatment also is often less expensive than relying on medications every day and in many cases, the shots eventually can be discontinued, along with the allergy medications, and the immunity maintained."

SURVIVAL TIPS to help allergy sufferers breathe easier this spring:

When possible, avoid or limit exposure to the allergy-causing substance. Be ready for allergy season. Plants and trees pollinate in predictable order every year. Antihistamines and other medications taken before exposure to allergy-causing substances can help prevent an outbreak of symptoms.

Air condition your car and home and keep your windows closed to keep the pollen out. Clean air conditioning units often to prevent mold growth.

Avoid windy weather. It can aggravate allergies.

Wear glasses or sunglasses when outdoors to keep pollen from irritating the eyes.

Wash hands often and rinse eyes with cool water after coming indoors to remove clinging pollen. Wash hair at night to prevent pollens from getting into bedding.

Take a vacation at the beach during peak allergy seasons. Ocean breezes can help clear away pollen and relieve allergy symptoms.

Tax-Smart Moves for 2005...and Beyond

stocks, bonds, certificates of deposit, government securities, etc.

Now that tax season is coming to an end, you may want to review your returns for opportunities to brighten your tax picture for next year. Specifically, are you paying too heavy a load on your investment income?

If so, you may want to explore some "tax-smart" moves for 2005 and future years. Consider these techniques: Tax-deferred investing, tax-free investing, and tax-efficient investing. Let's take a look at all three.

Tax-deferred investing

When you invest in a tax-deferred vehicle, you pay no taxes on your earnings until you start taking withdrawals (withdrawals prior to 50 ½ may be subject to a 10 percent penalty), so your money can grow faster than it would if placed in an investment on which you paid taxes every year. You have several tax-deferred options available, including the following:

- 401(k) - It's almost always a good idea to contribute as much as you can afford to your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. (In 2005, you can put in up to \$14,000 to your 401(k), or \$18,000 if you're 50 or older.) Your contributions are made with "pre-tax" dollars, so, the more you put in, the more you'll be able to reduce your adjusted gross income. And, of course, you get the benefit of tax-deferred earnings growth. Plus, your employer may match part of your contributions.
- Traditional IRA - In 2005, you can put in up to \$4,000 to a traditional IRA, or \$4,500 if you're 50 or older. Depending on your income level, your contributions may be tax deductible, but your earnings will always grown on a tax-deferred basis. Plus, you can fund your IRA with virtually any investment you choose:

Tax-free investing

One way to help reduce your investment taxes is to avoid paying taxes. And you can do that through municipal bonds and the Roth IRA.

- Municipal bonds - When you invest in municipal bonds, your interest payments are exempt from federal taxes - and possibly state and local taxes, as well. (However, municipal bonds may be subject to the alternative minimum tax, and any increase in principal value may be taxable.)
- Roth IRAs - Your Roth IRA earnings grow tax-free as long as you've had your account for at least five years and you don't begin making withdrawals until you're 59 1/2. Roth IRA contribution limits are the same as those for the traditional IRA, but certain income limits apply.

Tax-efficient investing

- "Buy-and-hold" - Income taxes aren't the only types of taxes associated with investing; you may also have to pay capital gains taxes. That's why it makes sense to be a "buy and hold" investor. If you hold your stocks for more than one year before selling them, then your gains will only be subject to a maximum capital gains rate of 15 percent (effective through Dec. 31, 2008). But if you sell your stocks within a year of buying them, then your gains will be taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

Start thinking "tax smart"

To see if the ideas mentioned above are suitable for your individual needs, consult with your investment and tax advisers. But take action soon - the quicker you start making tax-smart investments, the better your results will be.




